### Three Forms of Engagement with Change

1. Changing the things that we cannot accept
2. Accepting the things that we cannot change
3. Acknowledging that every *thing* is transient



This Sunday we'll experience Summer Solstice—the longest day of the year—a reminder of Great Spiral of change which is so much larger than any of us.

So let's gather in the ritual creation of a flower mandala. Then, in order to most fully experience its essence, its uniqueness, its most precious beauty, we'll release it into the flowing waters of time.

More specifically, we will continue our long-running spring tradition of Flower Communion, with a couple of changes from last year, which had a couple of changes from the year before....

On Saturday, please come to BUF between 11 and 1 to place your flower(s) on the mandala, which will find its own symmetry as it grows. (Or you can drop flowers off from your car, also from 11 to 1; we'll take pictures to share afterward.)

Then on Sunday at 10:30, tune in on Zoom as usual ... and/or come to Maritime Heritage Park, where we'll be releasing the mandala into Whatcom Creek at about 11:30.

So, you can come early to enjoy the morning at the park (it's predicted to be lovely) while attending the service via Zoom on your phone or laptop. Or join us virtually from anywhere else, then zoom down to the park before 11:30. The release of the mandala will also be shared in real time on Zoom at 11:30.

We'll release of the mandala just below the Dupont Street bridge. Our current guidelines specify distancing outdoors, but no masking. So when the time comes, please spread out on the bridge above, the footbridge below the falls, and on the walkways above the falls on both sides of the creek.

The times are a-changing, again. Some things we longed for—long ago—are coming into being. And some things that we'd never anticipated now present us with new reasons—and new ways—to become Beloved Community.

## A Virtual Interfaith Music Festival and Celebration of Interfaith Congregations



The Interfaith Coalition Music Festival has been an annual highlight for many years. BUF's own Kevin Allen-Schmid, who has directed the festival in previous years, has created a musical film instead of holding an in-person festival.

This 42-minute film features photos and music from all 41 member congregations of Interfaith Coalition – an historic first. The grand finale is a virtual choir, featuring 57 singers from congregations across Whatcom County and beyond.

We are thrilled to highlight BUF and our other congregations in this film. You have been part of Interfaith's work to help vulnerable Whatcom County children and adults - originally, in gaining access to medical care for all, and now in helping them escape poverty and homelessness. Seeing your congregation spaces and hearing your voices raised in song is a visual and auditory reminder of the beauty of our diversity and of your commitment to working together for the good of your neighbors.


### Chalice Circles

## BUF Financial Snapshot – Sky Hedman, BUF Treasurer

At the end of April, BUF was 83% into the fiscal year that runs from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Our financial status is summarized in the snapshot below. The snapshot shows that our operating income stands at 90% of our goal for the year, and our expenses are 88% of what we projected. Because our income is exceeding our expenses, we can reasonably expect to reach the end the fiscal year “in the black” with minimal use of our reserves. The non-operating contributions are equally positive.

You are invited to our first in-person Community to Community (C2C) Partnership meeting with Rosalinda and others

from C2C in about 2 years! Discussion will include, joint action on some of the Beloved Community issues Rosalinda raised recently and updates on C2C activities.

As we are meeting at BUF, BUF rules apply: Anyone who is not fully vaccinated should wear a fully-covering mask with a filter insert (also called triple masking) and sit at a physical distance from others. There will be a sign on the front door of BUF directing you to the exact meeting space. If the weather is fine, we may meet outside (the sign will say)--so please bring something to sit on (blanket, cushion, chair) just in case.

One thing that C2C is hoping for is increased (perhaps even with a Board membership) BUF participation with the Immigration Advisory Board for the City. Advisory Board meetings are run in Spanish & English, and for someone who speaks Spanish (or is working on their Spanish), participating might be a rich experience. I encourage you to attend to learn of participation opportunities.

Historians of a certain persuasion follow the approach of the tongue down—the long duration. They describe history-making as a connection of deeply consequential and nearly imperceptible events from a stored past.

In the spirit of the longer dures, the ongoing 2021 Red Road Totem Pole journey to DC did not begin in the spring of 2021. Actually it began in February of 1982 and the first in a series of extraordinary encounters experienced with my longtime brother in arms, Master Carver Jewell James.

One accidental encounter, one enigmatic event led us to and through others, eventually, inevitably, harmoniously resulting in a 24' totem pole journeying through Native American sacred landscapes by way of sacred obligations to the recently deposed Capitol of a so-called American Nation.

Today we will go together on the journey to the 2021 journey—a journey within a journey that makes me wonder.

About the deep staying behind every movement in every moment.

About how history weaves its crystals and from it emerges an enigmatic unfolding.

About how one thing imperceptibly becomes another within a miscellaneous field of correspondence until an unlikely meeting in 1982 between a Spirit Dancer, a priest and a Senator becomes a totem pole.

## Rapid Response Phone Tree Established



BUF Black Lives Matters Ministry Action Team developed a Rapid Response Phone Tree to alert interested congregants of vigils for momentous events, especially events affecting people of color. The current tree has about 60 people from the BUF congregation who said they wanted to be involved.

Ten of the people on the list would call the others.

We the BUF Rapid Response Phone Tree for the first time in April to alert congregants of a candlelight vigil held at Maritime Heritage Park to recognize Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders recently murdered. The vigil was organized by the Whatcom Peace and Justice Center, Whatcom Focused Youth Movement, Whatcom CARE and Whatcom Human Rights Task Force. At the vigil, many BUFsters assembled that evening. We sat together, with candles and listened to local speakers of Asian American and Pacific Island heritage, describe their personal experiences of racism in Whatcom County. The vigil began and ended with songs by William John, from the Lummi Nation.



## BUF-SEJC Special Collection, June 2021: Whatcom Family and Community Network/MAD-HOPE – Sita Amba-Rao, BUF SEJC



The Whatcom Community and Family Network (WCFN) mission is to envision a thriving community. In this context WCFN's MAD HOPE program was introduced. **Making a Difference—Helping Other People Everywhere (MAD HOPE)** Youth Suicide Prevention program is a unique peer-to-peer training that reduces stigma around mental health issues and suicide. Suicide is a major public health concern among youth (age 15-24 years). The MAD HOPE program educates youth (typically in middle schools and high schools) to recognize warning signs and risk factors among their peers and identify protective factors that can prevent suicide. The program teaches practical skills in providing peer support for youth contemplating suicide. It aims to increase awareness of the power youth have to save lives through connection with one another and to identify caring adults to go to for resources and support.

*“MAD HOPE provides much needed exposure to the issue of youth suicide and engages youth in meaningful discussions. They provide essential resources all from a place of care and compassion. I highly recommend the program for Middle School and High School youth.” – Kelly Giles, Shuksan staff*

The reasoning behind this approach is that the students are close to each other, they see and listen to what their peers are saying and feeling and, therefore, that they are the best source to detect any signs of despair, and suicidal thoughts
