Message from Paul

When Things are Not Fixed

Fixed can mean repaired. This calls to my mind a Jewish concept of "repairing the world," which refers to the purpose of human life: finishing the work of creation.

Fixed can also mean set in place. This calls to my mind things that are positive, like balance and security... and also negative, like lethargy, or wilful ignorance.

Having a fixed position, or being stubborn, is a doubleedged sword. Stubbornness can be about commitment and loyalty, or it can be self-righteousness, or unwillingness to

compromise.

Right now, for the most part, things do not seem fixed as I might like them to be. Reflecting on 9/11—twenty years



later—I have a hard time recognizing repaired relationships, or international security. In the rise and fall and rise and fall of covid, and in political polarization, I feel great uncertainty.

In change and uncertainty, we experience the incomprehensibility of time unfolding...and the wonder of life evolving. Perhaps, too, we may be living witnesses to consciousness-of-our-oneness expanding.

In Unitarian tradition, we honor the teaching that "revelation is not sealed." It's not only that we don't yet know everything, but what there is to know is itself expanding. The unfolding of time, the dynamism of human experience, life's adaptation to new conditions, and our growing openness to truths known through art, intuition, poetry, laughter, nature, and our relationships with each other and with all of the above. Infinitely expanding.

The United Church of Christ uses the tagline: "God is still speaking."

Instead of the pretence of certainty, all of this points us toward knowing only that "this is my best understanding with what I know now."

Imagine yourself as part of an infinite web of being. Do you imagine this web as a fixed state? Do our connections with one another—and with all being—mean permanent stasis? That there is no wiggle room, no repairs possible, no opportunities to change course?

I sometimes wish for more stability, and sometimes feel stuck. How might we find blessing in both change and stillness? This musing, of course, is unfinished.

BUF Choir Rehearsals Resume – Where the Spirit Sings Kevin Allen-Schmid, BUF Music Director kevin@buf.org


We had 37 enthusiastic singers at our Wednesday choir rehearsal and 27 die hards on Sunday for our service in the rain, a true Water

Eracism Minute - Cat McIntyre, Black Lives Matter Ministry Action Team

For over a year, I have been working with Black Lives Matter and many others in the congregation on anti-racism and anti-oppression training to continue the learnings from the Beloved Conversations program two years ago.

We organized in-person workshops led by black women professionals experienced in working with groups to achieve goals like ours. We invited other UU congregations in Blaine and Mt. Vernon to join us. We contracted for the first series of workshops.

Our goal is for the entire BUF congregation to learn how to live its commitment toward Beloved Community.

However, because of the current upsurge in

COVID in our community, we considered holding the workshops on zoom instead of in person. Now, with input from experienced educators, we realize that this training will lose its impact on zoom. So, we have decided to **postpone** the workshops until later in the year when, hopefully, we can meet safely in person.

I want to add a second, very important, reason to postpone: **the recent resignation of yet another BUF Board president requires serious reflection NOW for all of us.** We must work on BUF governance, policies and procedures, and how we deal with conflict within our congregation.

Our Healthy Relationships Covenant is designed for one-on-one problems, not systemic dysfunction. When we have resolved this important issue in a way that is consistent with a Beloved Community, BUF will be more likely to benefit from anti-racism/anti-oppression workshops.

BUF SEJC Special Collection – September 2021: Humanitas Ministry – Jane Ronca Washburn

The mission of the Humanitas Ministry is to provide support to people in need, in a safe, warm and non-judgmental atmosphere. Since 2013, we have listened **c**arefully to their stories, and offered financial assistance and referrals to other churches and community agencies as needed. In addition to BUF, as part of a faith community we work in partnership with St. Paul's Episcopal Church Alms Ministry, Assumption Catholic Church (Hope House), the Ministry of St. Vincent de Paul and Hillcrest Church. We are an integral part of Bellingham's Community Resource Network.

When BUF closed its building in March 2020 because of Covid, Humanitas needed to think outside the box to keep the ministry functioning. We took a couple of weeks to organize to provide a telephone hotline, a specifically-designed website for aid applications, text/email for additional information, and distribution of vouchers/checks via the US mail. We were hoping that on Wednesday, September 15, 2021, the entire masked ministry team would be able to return to BUF to welcome people in need, in person, once more, but the increase in Covid infections, among those vaccinated as well as those unvaccinated, has postponed our in-person opening. We will describe more of our journey at the BUF Special Collection for the Humanitas Ministry on Sunday, September 19, 2021.
