RAISING CHILDREN IN A RACE CONSCIOUS SOCIETY

February 11 and 25 from 10:30-11:45



This class is designed for parents, guardians and grandparents who want to be prepared for The Talk that every family needs to have about race.

This will be an opportunity to share learnings and insights, as well as gain new tools for talking in healthy ways about race.

The class will be led by James Addington, author, antiracism training consultant, and part of a multiracial family. James and his wife, Cheryl, are currently parenting a five-year-old granddaughter of color. "She is a daily source of insights, questions and new puzzles," according to James. SUPPORTING PEOPLE WITH SERIOUS MENTAL HEALTH CONDITIONS

Our congregation's covenant of love and understanding goes out to the 1 in 5 among us living with a mental health condition, and the 1 in 25 with a severe mental illness such as schizophrenia, bipolar illness, or major debilitating depression.

I have learned of a new resource in Bellingham called Whatcom Clubhouse-- a mental health safe place where people can come and find support and empowerment. Whatcom Clubhouse is not a behavioral health treatment program nor a minimally supervised drop-in center. It is a solid setting for persons who are not in a mental health crisis but who could use a specific, supportive community and a way to invest time with others and find purpose in their Mon-Fri.
