Update on Article II Changes

Many of us are familiar with Article II of the Unitarian Universalist Association by-laws, in particular, the seven principles and six sources that define our faith and practice. But did you know that under UUA bylaws, we review Article II every 15 years?

In 2020 the UUA Article II Study Commission commenced such a review. They met with congregations nationwide, gathered comments, and solicited amendments to determine how Article II can better reflect the UUA as it grows.

Last year we at BUF engaged in discussions about the proposed Article II revisions. The seven principles have been replaced by six shared values: Interdependence, Pluralism, Justice, Transformation, Generosity, and Equity. Sources have been replaced by Inspirations. The core principles have endured, but in a different form.

At the 2023 General Assembly (GA) delegates voted to accept the revised Article II.

This June, the GA will vote on the final adoption of the amended Article II. A 2/3 majority is required to move to fully adopt the changes. (See https://www.uua.org/files/2023-10/a2_final_line_num_10312023.pdf)
