UPDATE ON ARTICLE II CHANGES

Many of us are familiar with Article II of the Unitarian Universalist Association by-laws, in particular: the seven principles and six sources that define our faith and practice. But did you know that under UUA bylaws, we review Article II every 15 years?

In 2020, the UUA Article II Study Commission commenced such a review. They met with congregations nationwide, gathered comments and solicited amendments to determine how Article II can better reflect the UUA as it grows. Last year, we at BUF engaged in discussions about the proposed Article II revisions. The seven principles have been replaced by six shared values: Interdependence, Pluralism, Justice, Transformation, Generosity, and Equity. Sources have been replaced by Inspirations. The core principles have endured, but in a different form.

At the 2023 General Assembly (GA), delegates voted to accept the revised Article II.

This June, the GA will vote on the final adoption of the amended Article II. A two-third's majority is required to fully adopt the changes. (See https://www.uua.org/files/2023-10/a2_final_line_num_10312023.pdf)

SOCIAL JUSTICE COLLECTION FOR MAY: DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT SERVICES (DVSAS)

The mission of DVSAS is to support people affected by domestic violence, sexual assault, and sexual exploitation, aiding the community in its efforts to end these abuses of power. Survivors find shelter and safety there, and then move on to find their own stability.

This constant turnover of people requires frequent maintenance work, more than the ordinary repairs and replacement of fixtures and furniture. In the past, BUF collections supported DVSAS in its various projects to renovate and expand services to reach out to diverse populations--including marginalized communities of Whatcom County. Particularly, the organization translated pages on its website into Spanish and Russian, and subscribed to magazines and children's items to meet the varied user-groups.

Next Sunday--at the BUF May 5th service-- Marjie George, Director of Development, will inform our congregation about the critical role DVSAS plays in our local community.
