This year will continue the tradition of the canoe journey throughout the islands; however, the main event will take place on May 25 from 9:00 AM-6:00 PM in Bellingham amongst the Ski to Sea activities. Guest speakers, music and welcoming ceremony, water blessings, and GOTE canoes will be landing at Waypoint (waterfront) starting at 9:00 AM. About 11:00 AM, we'll move up to Maritime Heritage Park, where traditional protocol and speakers will continue, and there will be Indigenous food and arts and crafts vendors.
