From the Stewardship Team

Congratulations to the BUF community on a VERY SUCCESSFUL pledge drive!

This year we focused primarily on communication:

- ♦ Explaining BUF's financial situation
- ♦ Listening to concerns of BUF members and friends
- Emphasizing our connection to one another

The response was amazing. We had excellent engagement at our "Listening" meetings. Over 40 canvassers stepped up to make one-on-one calls and visits. We received a total of 162 pledges, well over our goal of 142. The total pledged for 2024-25 was \$350,057*, which is a real testament to the strength and vision of our BUF community.

* Although this brings us up to our target of \$350,000, we have lost some rental income and have also chosen to bring salaries slightly closer to UU-recommended levels and begin funding our reserves again after a several-year gap, which means we will still be reducing the number of hours for our Lifelong Learning and Choir Director positions.

Here are the details:

- o 162 pledges were received, totaling \$350,057; this surpassed our goal of \$350,000
- o 130 current year pledgers pledged \$320,629, a 7% increase from their pledges for the current church year
- o 6 prior pledgers pledged \$3,130
- o 26 first time pledgers pledged \$26,298 (7.5% of the total amount pledged)
- o Only 12 of the current pledgers canvassed did not respond
- o The drive concluded much sooner than last year
- o The average pledge is \$2,161
- o The median pledge is \$1,360

A big THANK YOU to our 40 canvassers who made personal connections that build our community; to the BUF staff who helped with everything, especially Paul who got us started early this year, and Michele who gracefully managed spreadsheets and questions while simultaneously responding to multiple unrelated phone calls; and to the many BUF volunteers who stepped up when we needed them most.

We are particularly grateful to Rick "Vlad" Steele, who has been a steady source of energy at BUF for many years and will be taking a break from stewardship this next year – Way to go out on a high note, Vlad! Lee Seaman and John Jurceka will continue to keep the stewardship ball rolling.

And finally and most important, our grateful thanks to everyone in the BUF community. Without you, none of this could happen!

Children will start in the Sanctuary where we have a child-friendly space with pillows, drawing supplies, fidget boxes, and a front-row seat for the


Story of All Ages or interactive song. After the Children's Focus, we will head upstairs where we will explore our theme through stories, activities, games, and art.

His name was chosen in the lottery, and they were offered a place in a brand-new apartment building. Normally we're unable to help with deposits, but working with the rest of the network we were able to cover this expense for them. It's always rewarding being able to offer a hand up as a person is making a new start.
