I've just finished the novel, Martyr! by Kaveh Akbar. Here's an excerpt:

Cyrus knew little about anything and tried to remember that. He read once about a Sufi prayer that went "Lord, increase my bewilderment." That was the prayer in its entirety.

The performance of certainty seemed to be at the root of so much grief. Everyone in America seemed to be afraid and hurting and angry, starving for a fight they could win. And more than that even, they seemed certain that their natural state was to be happy, contented, and rich. The genesis of everyone's pain had to be external, such was their certainty. And so legislators legislated, building border walls, barring citizens of there from entering here. "The pain we feel comes from them, not ourselves," said the banners, and people cheered, certain of all the certainty. But the next day they'd wake up and find that what had hurt in them still hurt.

Today is September 11:A memorial of cruelty instigated by certainty instigated by cruelty instigated by cruelty.

May we, live more gently with our uncertainty ... so that, within our own sphere of influence, we interrupt this grievous cycle.

Humanitas Ministry

Joe and Lynn came in several weeks ago looking for help. It was obvious that Lynn was in the middle of a mental health crisis. They're homeless, carrying all their belongings in several backpacks. While looking for her ID Lynn spread her belongings around the reception area. She was unable to communicate with us in a way we could understand. We gave her some space and worked with Joe to meet his need of a voucher for clothing. He explained that Lynn used to be a teacher, that she was doing great until she went off her medication. Homelessness and mental health issues so often go hand in hand. This was a tough situation, one we were able to get through and provide help for both of them as well as come up with a plan for future experiences like this. If you know of someone who needs immediate mental health help you can call 911 and state that, they'll send out a team of mental health professionals to deal with the situation. Thank you for your continued support which allows us to help this population.

The BUF Auction Returns this Fall - November 2



BUF Text to Give


BUF has established a Text-to-Give phone number to enable people to donate to the church through their smartphone. The number is (360) 345-3933 and the donations are directly fed into our Breeze church management database and credited to the donor's Giving history.

There are three donation options. For example to donate \$5, text as follows noting the keyword following the amount:


\$5 Plate	a donation to BUF
\$5 SEJC	a donation to BUF's monthly Special Social Justice Collection
\$5 Taize	a donation for BUF's Taize services

If you do not include a keyword, your donation will go to **Plate**.

The first time you do this, you will receive a message that states "It looks like you are a new user" and provides a link. Something like this:



Once you select this link, you will be taken through brief steps to enter information to complete the initial transaction on a page like this:



Once you enter this information and click the "Continue button", you will receive a text acknowledging your generosity and giving the option to type "refund" if you made a mistake.

You have successfully registered this phone and completed your donation. To give in the future, simply text 'give' to this number.

After this first donation you will be set up to swiftly and easily make any further donations without the need to fill in the data, by just texting an amount to (360) 345-3933 – "\$5" – or an amount and a fund – "5 Taize".

You can even scan this QR code which should take you directly to your phone's messaging app:
