Thank you all for your well-wishes in regard to my announcement about retiring next summer.

Congregations spend much of that first year reflecting together on who they are and who they want to become. The bulk of the official search takes place in the second year.

So: BUF has nine months to get ready to begin this two-year process. While there will be a lot to learn (mostly for BUFsters to learn about BUF), this is plenty of time to proceed methodically. The Unitarian Universalist Association has terrific resources to guide you. My role will be as a consultant on the process—not making decisions, not giving opinions on details. Over the next few months, the BUF Board will take care of the initial necessities, and keep you up to date on what you need to know.

Download - The American Red Cross First Aid free app

Our BUF Safety and Security Committee (Sarah Pearson, Elie Steele, Jim Reimer, Felice Davis, Michelle Fox, Paul Beckel, me) continues addressing safety concerns for our community. Traditionally, many organizations developed their own internal Safety/Emergency/First Aid hard-copy flip charts to help folks quickly find out how to respond to emergencies. In recent years, most organizations that provide such information have moved to online apps for the same purpose. Our Committee strongly recommends that all BUF members and friends download a free phone app called "The American Red Cross First Aid" app. It's easy to download and use (the litmus test being that even I can easily use it). It has clear/succinct steps-to-follow for the sorts of emergencies that we might encounter at BUF (e.g., fainting, fractures, concussions, diabetic emergencies, etc....). One advantage of the Red Cross app is that the Red Cross will always update the information—a very time-consuming process if we had to do it ourselves. Of the many such apps available, but this one seems to be one of the easiest to use. As we move into the new church year, our Committee will host a number of safety training events—some of which may reference American Red Cross information. 
This week's menu is Chili, cornbread, and salad. Suggested donation is \$5.00 per/person, children 12 and under are free. Come and enjoy!
