October 20th Special Feature: A Fire Drill

At the beginning of the October 20 service this coming Sunday, Paul will announce that, at the end, we will have a fire drill to ensure that, in case of emergency, we can evacuate safely and find one another easily as we all gather in one place.

- From the sanctuary, exit only on the I Street doors (front or back of the sanctuary). Then gather on the lawn across I Street and remain there until the fire department gives the all-clear.
- Children will be escorted by their teachers from the opposite side of the building. Parents, please do not go into the building to find your kids or you may put them and yourself at greater risk. They too will gather on the lawn across I Street.
- If not for yourself, please participate for the sake of those who are less mobile than you are. We need to ensure that all the pieces come together so the most vulnerable will be safe.

American Red Cross First Aid App

Our BUF Safety and Security Committee (Sarah Pearson, Elie Steele, Jim Reimer, Felice Davis, Michelle Fox, Paul Beckel, me) continues addressing safety concerns for our community. Traditionally, many organizations developed their own internal Safety/Emergency/First Aid hard-copy flip charts to help folks quickly find out how to respond to emergencies. In recent years, most organizations that provide such information have moved to online apps for the same purpose. **Our Safety and Security Committee strongly recommends that all BUF members and friends download a free phone app called** <u>"First Aid: American Red Cross" app</u>. It's easy to download and use (the litmus test being that even I can easily use it). It has clear/succinct steps-to-follow for the sorts of emergencies that we might encounter at BUF (e.g., fainting, fractures, concussions, diabetic emergencies, etc....). One advantage of the Red Cross app is that the Red Cross will always update the information—a very time-consuming process if we had to do it ourselves. Of the many such apps available, but this one seems to be one of the easiest to use.

As we move into the new church year, our Committee will host a number of safety training events—some of which may reference American Red Cross information. We ask that you help this effort by downloading the app to your phone and experimenting with it for a few minutes. Questions? Call Michael Berres at 360-393-6802.

A note on the November Auction from Drew Betz:


<u>This year's auction</u> falls on the traditional Día de los Muertos holiday, celebrated throughout the Latinx diaspora. We chose to use the decorations and food for our auction to honor the holiday and appreciate the meaning it has in our lives. Our UUA advises that to do a worship service that uses all the elements associated with the holiday would not be appropriate. We have very carefully taken the elements that are shared throughout the world as appreciation of the holiday.

We are inviting people to share a dessert made from a recipe from your family that evokes your own ancestors. We are going to set up an ofrenda, a small altar for you to bring a photo or object that represents your legacy or beloveds who have passed. We are asking that your Halloween costumes stay home. This is not a continuation of Halloween.

I have been honored to participate in a number of Día de los Muertos celebrations, including a trip to Oaxaca, Mexico, in 2022 during the holidays. This holiday has become personally meaningful for me as I have used it to celebrate the life and death of my daughter Kate who passed in 2002. I invite you to think about how you celebrate your own ancestry and loved ones who have passed. I like to think of Kate as donning her finest dress, flowers in her hair and dancing to the music the holiday brings.
