Sunday, Nov 17, 10:30am - Looking at Prayer with Fresh Eyes, Tom Nicholas, Alan Friedlob, Paul Beckel

Prayer is not just about speaking and hearing. Recognizing what is before us, seeing what is true, creating visual arts that express our questions, aspirations, regrets ... these too can be forms of prayer.

Perspective Words from Paul



If you're feeling overwhelmed, or powerless, amidst too much uncertainty, here's something that helps give me perspective. Picture concentric circles:

- The largest is your <u>circle of concern</u>. It's the full scope of things you care about.
- Inside that is a smaller <u>circle of influence</u>. This covers the parts of your concerns you may be able to have an impact on by enlisting and directing the efforts of others.
- Inside that is a smaller <u>circle of control</u>. This covers the things you have direct control over through your own effort.

The things in my circle of concern are so vast ... it would be impossible to focus on them all. I need to remember that that's OK. Not-focusing on things I cannot control doesn't mean I don't Care.

If you find yourself pulled in so many directions that you can't go in any direction, it might be helpful—as each bit of trouble (or opportunity) comes to mind—to explicitly place it within one of these circles.

This is grief-work, not just a cognitive exercise. We will find ourselves grieving, again and again when we acknowledge that we don't have control, or even influence, over circumstances and people we care about. When others are suffering ... when others are suffering unnecessarily ... it hurts. It's demoralizing.

But there's one more circle that helps me cope—millions of them actually. These are the overlapping circle-sets of allies. Among these Venn diagrams we see there are still many things over which no one has control. But also that we're not alone in our grief and suffering. And our collective influence becomes synergy.

So may we have courage to do the things we can. And deep appreciation for one another.

Safety & Security Training Session Unsafe Intruders

Monday, November 18, 4:00-5:15 pm, Sanctuary

Led by Bellingham Police Department Officer Jon Knutsen

BUF's Safety and Security Committee (Elie Steele, Sarah Pearson, Michelle Fox, Jim Reimer, Felice Davis, Paul Beckel, me) continues its work to enhance congregational safety. The specific issue of unsafe intruders is one that has unfortunately hit too many UU congregations. On Monday, November 18 from 4:00 to 5:15 pm in the Sanctuary, we present our next BUF training session on this topic.

Officer Jon Knutsen of the Bellingham Police Department will teach us how we might best deal with a situation if someone enters BUF with an intent to do serious harm—he does the important training for many organizations in Bellingham. This session is part of our overall training package in which we've set up: fire drills, first-aid/CPR training; de-escalation strategies for community members with acting-out mental health concerns; and other areas. While we're fortunate to be close to police headquarters, there are still some things that we can do in those few interim moments before police support arrives—Officer Knutsen will help us learn those things.

International Human Rights Day Event Living in Palestine: A Personal Experience Thursday, December 10, 6:30-8:00pm

BUF's <u>Social and Environmental Justice Committee</u> and <u>Write for Rights</u> has invited a man from the West Bank in Palestine to speak with us in honor of International Human Rights Day.

There may also be other speakers from Gaza participating. Opportunities to sign Write for Rights petitions will be available, and all information shared will be about the most effective organizations helping people in Gaza right now.

No charge, but a free will offering will be accepted during the talk to benefit one of these organizations. All who come in the spirit of goodwill are welcome.

About the Speaker:

Adam (no last name for his family's safety) is a 26-year-old from the Palestinian village of Wadi Foquin located in the Bethlehem District of the West Bank. He is currently in the U.S. and speaking on behalf of the Friends of Wadi Foquin to educate audiences on the Palestinian reality now. Growing up under the Israeli military occupation, Adam also shares his personal experiences of West Bank life prior to the events of October 7, 2023. <u>Friends of Wadi Foquin</u> is an interfaith partnership created in 2009 between United Methodists in California and the Palestinian Muslim village of Wadi Foquin which supports community development projects in the village, organizes annual trips to the West Bank, and provides advocacy for the village against illegal settlement expansion and land confiscation. Adam holds a B.A. in Engineering from Polytechnic University in Hebron.
