International Human Rights Day Event Living in Palestine: A Personal Experience Tuesday, December 10, 6:30-8:00pm

BUF's <u>Social and Environmental Justice Committee</u> and <u>Write for Rights</u> has invited a man from the West Bank in Palestine to speak with us in honor of International Human Rights Day.

There may also be other speakers from Gaza participating. Opportunities to sign Write for Rights petitions will be available, and all information shared will be about the most effective organizations helping people in Gaza right now.

Free to attend, but a freewill offering will be accepted during the talk to benefit one of these organizations. All who come in the spirit of goodwill are welcome.

About the Speaker:

Adam (no last name for his family's safety) is a 26-year-old from the Palestinian village of Wadi Foquin located in the Bethlehem District of the West Bank. He is currently in the U.S. and speaking on behalf of the Friends of Wadi Foquin to educate audiences on the Palestinian reality now. Growing up under the Israeli military occupation, Adam also shares his personal experiences of West Bank life prior to the events of October 7, 2023. Friends of Wadi Foquin is an interfaith partnership created in 2009 between United Methodists in California and the Palestinian Muslim village of Wadi Foquin which supports community development projects in the village, organizes annual trips to the West Bank, and provides advocacy for the village against illegal settlement expansion and land confiscation. Adam holds a B.A. in Engineering from Polytechnic University in Hebron.

Transitions Ministry Update

In late October, the BUF Board authorized their board president to form the Transition Prep Team. That team—consisting of Claire Lending, board secretary; Henry Ohana, BUF member; and Lin Skavdahl, board president—is charged with ushering us through the process of selecting a two-year interim minister. Here is a rough timeline:

- November 2024:
 - Create plan for ongoing communication/input with BUF Congregation
- Jan./Feb. 2025:
 - Ensure we have sufficient funds to hire a two-year interim minister.
 - Meet with the UUA Transitions Office to communicate BUF's needs.
- April 2025:
 - BUF submits to UUA a description of BUF needs (called a search profile).
 - Perspective Interim Ministers submit to UUA their portfolios.
- May 2025:
 - Claire, Henry and I receive names of prospective interims interested in BUF.
 - We study applicants and, working with UUA, make a recommendation to the board.
 - Board votes to approve the applicant.
- August 2025:
 - Interim Minister begins their two-year term running from August 2025 to July 1, 2027.

NOTE: This is a relatively quick and uncomplicated process not at all like the process we will use to call a Settled (long-term) Minister. That process involves a Search Team voted into service by the BUF Congregation. That process begins in January of 2026. Stay tuned.

SEJC's December Special Collections Recipient IRIS (Immigrant Resources and Immediate Support)

This month's special collection is for <u>IRIS (Immigrant Resources and Immediate</u> <u>Support</u>). The organization's mission is to connect immigrants with existing resources in the community, and to provide immediate assistance to those experiencing a temporary period of crisis.

IRIS strives to respond very quickly to urgent situations with low-barrier access to support services. There is a detailed intake to determine first if connections can be made to other organizations that might offer assistance. We also identify resources that IRIS can provide quickly.

IRIS is committed to meeting the basic human needs of immigrant community members in crisis. Funds are used to provide food, hygiene items, clothing, baby supplies, and help with other critical needs. A portion of the funds can be used to assist with emergency medical expenses.

IRIS is committed to supporting immigrant community members with vulnerable immigration status who are in urgent need. Funds are used to provide essential resources such as food, emergency housing, and rental assistance to prevent evictions. We also offer hygiene products, clothing, baby supplies, and help with other critical needs. A portion of the funds can be used to assist with emergency medical expenses.

Safety Committee Seeking Members

Our BUF Safety Committee (Felice Davis, Jim Reimer, Sarah Pearson, Elie Steele, Michelle Fox, Paul Beckel, Michael Berres) seeks two or three more members to help us continue addressing safety issues.

Over the last six years, we have made lots of progress on generally behind-the-scenes improvements, but we still have many things that need to be addressed. The scope of our work has ranged from earthquake safety to AEDs to dangerous intruders to First-Aid kits. The Committee meets approximately every six weeks, though that can change as the need arises.
