Stewardship Update

March is Pledge Drive Month. A pledge is your annual promise to financially support BUF. It is usually paid once a month, but other options are also available.



Last year we received 160 pledges, and this year we hope to top that. We've just finished Week 2, and have received about 60 pledges so far. **Thank you if you have already pledged!**

Check out our Pledge Drive Graph, posted near the door into the sanctuary and also pictured on the left. We plan to give you an update every Sunday and also every week here in the Midweek Update.

Our pledges make up about 85% of BUF's annual income. Pledges keep the lights on, pay our staff and our mortgage, and support the infrastructure that sustains our community, both inside and outside our doors.

Pledges let our Board create a budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year. This year we are doing the draft budget especially early because we need budget numbers to start recruiting candidates in early April for our new interim minister.


First Aid bins: First Aid bins have been installed near the restrooms on each floor for your use. Narcan is included in the bins on the lower level and main level. The AED is located on the lower level in the social hall.

Incident Reports: If you use anything from a first aid bin, or participate in any kind of medical or mental health intervention at BUF (or at a BUF activity), please complete an incident report (located inside the bins) and return it to the BUF office immediately after the event.

The podcast reached global audiences with content on key issues including the environment, Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Indigenous language revitalization and elections.

Episodes have ranked in the top 20 and top 40 on Apple Podcasts. Personal Journals in the US and Canada. Audiences are global, ranking in the charts of countries as far away as Taiwan, Australia.

Defend Trans Lives: A Webinar for People of Faith
