Paddle Call Proposals for BUF Auction

Deadline: April 30; Auction date: October 4, 2025

You may be familiar with paddle calls—a fundraising tool used at gala events to raise cash funds. The funds may go to supporting the mission of the organization or a

specific project. In past years, BUF auction attendees have funded such items as the replenishing of emergency reserves and updates to the BUF website.

This year the Board is planning ahead for the October 2025 auction. If you have an idea for a project, consider submitting a proposal. A good project is one that doesn't exceed \$10,000, it solves a specific BUF problem, can be completed within one year, and will generate wide support. Proposals must include such details as the cost of materials and labor based on researched estimates, and a timeline for completion. If your project will depend on volunteers it will identify who is willing to help.

SEJC's April Special Collections Recipient The Airow Project



"One organization that fulfills our practice of living together is AIROW: Adaptive & Inclusive Recreation of Whatcom County"—Rev. Paul Beckel, on Earth Day/Easter, April 20, 2025.

The eloquent talk of the founder of Airow Project, April Katz, at the last Sunday service was about how and why the adaptive and inclusive project for disabled children and youth arose (based on her own painful experiences in overcoming barriers), how it was fostered by the dedicated staff and volunteers, and its transforming impact on the youth and their families. All of this moved the full-house at BUF to great applause.

Airow's numerous, adaptive, and unique activities throughout the year altered the lives of these youth (and their families), giving them confidence, independence, and joy for outdoor recreation, resulting in its impact on the whole community.

The newest Summer Camp, with its numerous inclusive experiences and of wider scope covering others, has added value to the program. The cost for Airow is estimated at \$2,800 per camper, for the seven-week program, for which 15 have signed up. (A separate small program costs \$180 with four signed up). Donors can contribute to individual parts such as staffing or equipment. Airow just received notification that the Federal government cut their current year's grant of \$10,000. This adds to their total expenses. So, let us come together and act, giving as much as we can, and fulfill our covenant of inclusiveness and equity beyond BUF. Those who have not given yet or those wanting to give more, remember, the rest of April is available to drop off cash or checks in the BUF Office.

This meeting is held on Zoom to facilitate all the organizational presentations. The meeting will be held beginning at 12:30pm or 1:00pm on Wednesday, May 7. The length of the meeting will depend on the number of applicants.
