OK, maybe that would feel even more awkward. BUT, what if both parties got to know this tiny ritual? What if we were to start with one another here at BUF? Will you give it a try?



Our Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2025-26

We are close!! So close. As of last Thursday afternoon, we had \$355,000 in pledges. **NOW WE HAVE \$357,980 IN PLEDGES**! But we are \$18,000 \$14,325 short of where we need to be. We have all the minimum expenses of our operation covered, such as mortgage and utilities. We've been able to fund a couple of important shortfalls. But what we may think of as discretionary costs don't really feel that way. In order to balance our proposed budget, the Board has had to

- eliminate a cost-of-living increase for our wonderful staff;
- cut back on our annual pledge to the UUA, which maybe needs it now, more than ever;
- reduce hours for Building Sextons and AV Technicians;
- cut back on maintenance of our beautiful BUF building;
- eliminate a needed upgrade to our WiFi;
- and defer an important external review of our financial statements

SEJC Contributes Towards Budget Shortfall

At the spring SEJC meeting, in addition to the regular agenda items the committee also talked about the budget shortfall. Because we know that without a strong healthy church, SEJC and all the work that the committee does would not be possible AND because we know that in order to have a thriving church we need a happy, well-compensated staff, SEJC voted to donate \$1,000 of our funds towards the \$18,000 shortfall to go towards staff cost of living increases.

We believe that social justice starts at home and that it is necessary for us to provide living wages for our staff - especially in our current inflationary economy. This is the second year in a row that SEJC has voted to give \$1,000 of its own funds to help the BUF budget. We hope that others will follow our lead and help make up the shortfall so that we can take care of our staff.

SEJC's April Special Collections Recipient The Airow Project



The AIROW Project runs many programs year-round, including hiking, swimming, kayaking, paddle boarding, scavenging, pickleball, and arts and crafts. Over the last four years, the Project has had a visible impact on the

disability community, the Bellingham community, and the outdoor community as a whole. The Project's current grant request is for their new Adaptive and Inclusive Summer Camp program to expand its scope to people aged 8-30, and to enhance the well-being of the Whatcom County community at large. Besides other expenses, contributions will cover costs, approximately, as follows:

- Two staff members \$4420
- Kayaking with community boating center \$350
- Pickleball equipment \$200
- Van rental for two trips, zoo/San Juan Island \$200
- Snacks \$60
- Camp supplies \$40
- Sponsor-a-camper \$350/week

Invitation to Attend Sunday Justice Collections Decision Meeting

This year, the Social and Environmental Justice Committee (SEJC) has decided to open the decision-making about monthly Sunday Justice Collection recipients to all interested members of the congregation.

Participating in this process is no small matter. First, participants are required to read in advance all the applications that have come in from various organizations. Second, all those voting are required to attend the full length (typically 3.5-4.5 hours) meeting, where we hear presentations from each applicant, as well as discuss our criteria and the pros and cons of various applicants. Of course, members of the congregation who wish to participate but not vote do not need to attend the full meeting.

This meeting is held on Zoom to facilitate all the organizational presentations. The meeting will be held beginning at 12:30pm or 1:00pm on Wednesday, May 7. The length of the meeting will depend on the number of applicants.
