## **Interim Minister Update**

As you know, Paul – our beloved minister of 11 years – is retiring. At the same time we are saying our goodbyes to him, the Transition Team (Claire Lending, Hank Ohana and Lin Skavdahl) is working with the Unitarian Universalist Association, our national organization, to choose an interim minister.

Unlike the Settled Minister Search Team who is elected by the congregation and spends an entire year looking for a minister, the Transition Team is appointed by the BUF Board and has only a few months to work with the UUA who ultimately chooses our best fit. We do have input, including interviewing and checking references, but it is the UUA who makes the selection. If all goes as planned, the potential minister is approved by the board and, as per UUA recommendations, serves for two years beginning August 1. If the board does not approve the choice, the Transition Team goes back to the UUA and we begin again. We are hoping for a successful match the first time around. This week, the Transition Team is conducting interviews and checking references. We hope to have news within two weeks.

SEJC's May Special Collections Recipient Bellingham Queer Collective



The Bellingham Queer Collective (BQC) connects, celebrates, unites, and advocates for the LGBTQ+ and BIPOC communities. The BQC started in 2022 and grew into a nonprofit organization, supporting over 3,000 people in Bellingham and beyond. The BQC is improving the Social Health of the queer community through arts, movement, nature, service, and belonging.

The BQC, partnering with Northwest Youth Services, opened the first LGBTQ+ community center, between Seattle and Canada, last year. The BQC is growing and just

obtained their own long term lease and moved into a new space in March.

The BQC Community Center space is a free, queer, 3rd Space for the 18+ community. Hosting peer-led groups including identity, recovery, social, and interest groups. They hold wellness and educational workshops, including fentanyl overdose awareness.

This all-volunteer organization relies on community contributions only. All funds collected support rent and operations. Immediate needs include purchasing basic furniture, equipment, and safety features including security cameras, window film, and new door hardware. Donations today will significantly impact the BQC June Pride Fundraiser Campaign titled "Unite and Thrive in 2025; Let's Raise \$30,000 in 30 Days."

Elizabeth came to us requesting money for the Airporter to SeaTac. She had been able to secure a round trip ticket to Richmond, VA, to be present at the birth of her first grandchild, but just needed this bit of extra help. She told how for many years she had been a successful preschool teacher in Marin County (CA) until required surgery left her in excruciating pain leading her to addiction to painkillers. It took years to get sober

resulting in years of homelessness and estrangement from her family, including the daughter who will be giving birth. St. Paul's bought her ticket to SeaTac; <u>Humanitas</u> bought the return ticket home (\$61).
