Summer Childcare

Summer Childcare, led by Lucy Major, began on June 29 and is similar to the regular school year, with all ages together in the Flex Room. They will begin in the service and will be prompted to go upstairs when it is time.

- **K-8** Children who will be in K-8 in the Fall will read stories and do arts and crafts with Lucy and their team
- **Pre-K (2-4y)** Children 2-4 years of age can go to the Pre-K room, also upstairs, where we have two adults supervising.

Parents are also welcome to stay with their children if they wish, or stay to enjoy the rest of the service. Pick-up is upstairs at 11:45am (enjoy some coffee first if you have time).

At BUF, families sit anywhere in the sanctuary that meets their needs and many sit near the children's rug in the front. The Wiggle Room is also available if you need it (The Wiggle Room is at the back of the sanctuary and has toys for younger children, chairs and hymnals for adults, and a large window and speaker to hear the service).



I have felt incredibly appreciated and have grown so much, both as a person and as a musician, during my tenure with you. I started when my kid was a baby, 23 years ago! Thank you for all the great years.

By advancing restorative justice and systemic change, we aim to reduce incarceration, strengthen families, and create pathways to meaningful

work and civic engagement—ensuring lasting value for individuals, families, and society as a whole.

Our successful programs and procedures produce a climate of nurturing, healing and guidance for our clients that allows rapid integration of our process. It is our experience that Restorative Justice can be expanded to the majority of existing cases for it is the healing of the trauma caused from an incident that allows an understanding for healing to occur.

Our focus is to reduce the harm, lessen the trauma and when possible bypass the justice system, reducing the jail population and overcrowded court system, thereby creating a safer community. Diversion programs are shown to reduce incarceration, court appearances, chaos, trauma and fear, which leads to more harmonious relationships within families and community.
