From Jesus to Christ: The First Christians - Jim Reimer

4 sessions - Sundays, September 7-28, 12:15-1:45pm, Flex Room

From Jesus to Christ traces the rise of Christianity, explore the life and death of Jesus, and the men and women whose conviction and martyrdom created the religion we now know as Christianity. Archaeological finds have yielded new understandings of Jesus' class and social status. Fresh interpretations offer new perspectives on the identity of the early Christian communities. Drawing upon historical evidence, the series challenges assumptions about Christian origins.

This course will shed light on one of the historical sources of our Unitarian Universalist faith, which began as a liberal Christian denomination several hundred years ago. Four video sessions with facilitated discussion. Feel free to bring a snack. Scholarships are available.



Humanitas

Humanitas is a ministry action team supported by individuahtributions from members of the BUF congregation. The program provides financial assistance as an expression of community service and operates in alignment with our Covenant:

"Love is the spirit of this fellowship and service gives it life."

Humanitas operates on a weekly basis to assist individuals experiencing financial difficulties, whether these challenges stem from unforeseen circumstances, prior decisions, or struggles to meet essential expenses. Recent economic and political developments have contributed to increased demand.

Humanitas volunteers listen, offer a safe, non-judgmental environment, and provide limited emergency support when possible. When needs exceed available funds, guests are referred to our comprehensive support network that includes St. Paul's Alms Ministry, St. Vincent de Paul Society at Sacred Heart, Hillcrest Chapel, and Interfaith Coalition. Pledges are then combined to address these larger needs. Through the generosity of donors and volunteers in 2024, this network provided around \$100,000 in support to the Community.

Services are available to guests on Wednesdays from 10:00 to 11:00am.

Social and Environmental Justice SEJC's August Special Collections Recipient Bellingham Food Bank

Because hunger is unacceptable, the <u>Bellingham Food Bank</u> (BFB) has, since 1972, provided free food to hungry people in Whatcom County while addressing the root causes of hunger in our communities.



Today BFB provides food to 5,000 families weekly with its Free Grocery Program, Drive Thru, and Home Deliveries. Through the Whatcom County Food Bank Network, BFB also is the food distribution center for Whatcom County.

When Federal SNAP funds (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) were cut in 2021, BFB's weekly visits

jumped from 1,700 families to 3,500. The new federal budget will cut SNAP funds further. The following funds have already been eliminated:

- 1. Local Food Purchase Assistance, providing \$180,000 to purchase food from local farmers
- 2. Emergency Food and Shelter Program, providing \$50,000
- 3. The Commodity Credit Corporation, providing \$650,000 worth of emergency assistance food

Washington is maintaining State funding, but new federal funding cuts bring huge challenges for hungry people and to BFB in its work to alleviate hunger. Learn more about BFB at bellinghamfoodbank.org, sign up for their newsletter, or arrange a tour.
